

A central component of the siddur, the weekday prayerbook, is the amidah prayer. The text took shape during the first decades after the destruction of the Second Temple, but is documented in manuscripts only from the Middle Ages. This volume publishes the earliest existing versions of the amidah prayer that have survived in fragments from the Cairo Genizah.
